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Our Mission Statement

The Center for House Church Theology (CHCT) desires to foster and further the international publishing of pastors, church leaders, and teachers committed to the historic gospel of grace in China's urban house churches.

In promoting the theological leadership of China's urban house churches, we believe dialogue between Christians in China and those from other cultural contexts will lead to mutual edification and sanctification.



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Executive Summary

The Need

We now profess to be part of a global church where the majority of Christians live outside of Europe and North America, and are pastored by indigenous leadership rather than cross-cultural missionaries. These churches worship, evangelize, and serve as faithful communities, often following Christ under cultural pressure and marginalization.

We must ask ourselves: how can the global church benefit from listening to pastors who have counted the cost of discipleship? How might theological reflection be enlivened by including the voices of those preaching the historic gospel of grace in the world's most challenging contexts? How does their faithfulness expose our cultural idols and blindspots?

It is time to hear the voices of the Chinese house church.

The Challenge

- Evangelical Christian literature has been dominated by pastors and theologians from Europe and North America.
- When global voices are published by Western evangelical publishers, they are often confined to discussions about missiology, ethnic studies, and anthropology. We need to treat house church leaders as authorities on theology, ecclesiology, discipleship, and prayer.
- Ministries based in Africa, India, the Middle East, and elsewhere desire to learn from authors who have endured suffering for their faith. They want a tested theology from tested pastors, like those from the Chinese house church, which has endured trials for more than 70 years.
- The Chinese house church has been cut off from the global church for most of its history. Without established relationships, excellent translation, and attention to security and context, publishing their voices would not be possible.



A Brief History

2021

The Center is launched with the help of generous seed funding.

- Published a total of 3 original long-form articles
- Signed 2 book contracts with major publishers
- Recruited 3 fellows and 3 advisors

2022

We finalized our non-profit status and published our first two trade books.

- Published 4 more original long-form articles on our website, as well as 3 study guides with responses from prominent thinkers outside of China
- Recruited 2 more fellows and 4 more advisors
- Successfully fundraised a \$10,000 matching grant
- Published Faith in the Wilderness with Kirkdale Press
- Published Faithful Disobedience with Intervarsity
 Press

2023

We made our website available in Chinese and began translating it for additional global audiences.

- Published 5 more original long-form articles on our website
- Signed 2 book contracts for books on Chinese prayers and the Psalms
- Launched our Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, and Bahasa Indonesian websites
- Recruited church partners, monthly and major donors to become over 50% self-sustaining

Our Objectives

We seek to publish and promote the leading voices of the contemporary Chinese house church for the global church. Our hope is to provide resources for the academic community, the evangelical publishing industry, and ultimately to resource the global church.

We have published:

- Academic Books such as Faithful Disobedience, a collection of primary resources from Wang Yi about the history and political theology of the house churches, which has inspired those in the post-Christian West.
- Inspirational Books such as Faith in the Wilderness, which has encouraged global Christians and congregations with the pastoral voice of the Chinese house church.



- Papers, Sermons and Articles from China, translated and published free of charge on our website.
- **Commissioned Responses** by prominent thinkers outside of China, creating a dialogue with Chinese house church leaders which has not been possible through traditional channels.
- A Trilingual Resource Site to connect Chinese, Indonesian, and English language believers with the writings of the house church.



Global Translation Project

We believe that the house church in China, which has endured nearly a century of persecution, has an important perspective for the global church to hear. It is particularly relevant for contexts where Christians are under political and cultural pressure or outright persecution.

Currently our primary audience consists of English speakers. By using automated translation technology and vetted translators and editors, we have begun translating our website into languages for contexts under persecution. We hope to resource these churches to endure their situations and remain committed to effectively testifying to God's kingdom, even under duress.

In 2023, we made our website available in Simplified and Traditional Chinese and in Bahasa Indonesian.

In 2024, we hope to make our website and articles available in the following languages:


